Update on Village School

Closter's state-mandated plan for Affordable Housing was approved by the courts last month. Now we have immunity from developer remedy lawsuits through 2025. We are working with the Bergen County Housing Authority to design and build the project which will provide housing for at least 35 families. Due to the

lengthy process of obtaining Federal grants, which are required to make the project financially viable, it is expected that construction will commence in about 2 years.

Closter Shade Tree Commission

The Borough of Closter's Shade Tree Commission has been following the problem of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) in an effort to assist with the management of this deadly infestation affecting the beautiful ash trees located within our community. Members of the Closter Shade Tree Commission have inspected the ash trees and have found a significant infestation here.

The Emerald Ash Borer first infests the top of the tree's crown, which results in crown die-back. This makes the top of the tree brittle and likely to break off, resulting in a potentially dangerous situation. Trees will only live an average of 3 to 4 years after infestation; 99% of ash trees will die.

In the following weeks, the Shade Tree Commission will be sending a letter to Closter's homeowners who are known to have ash trees, infected or not. The trees located on properties owned by the Borough will be addressed accordingly. Additional information on the Emerald Ash Borer will be available on the Borough's website.

RECYCLING Reminder!

The Borough is very proud of its commitment to recycling. Comingled recycling (blue barrel) is picked up on Wednesdays; paper/cardboard is picked up on Thursdays, document shredding is held twice a year for residents (April 6th and November 2nd); yard debris and vegetative waste are collected twice a month and curbside leaf pickup takes place from October through December. Both Whole Foods and Stop & Shop have plastic bag recycle bins in their stores. The bins are for all plastic bags drop off and is not restricted to customers...drop-in's are welcome! ShopRite stores have plastic bag recycle bins near the entrances and exits. There are ShopRite stores in Emerson and Northvale. Additionally, there is a plastic bag recycle bin at the Closter DPW building. Together, by practicing every day recycling, we can all keep *Closter Green*. Recycling is not an option; it is the law!

Closter Senior Shared Transportation Service

In cooperation with Harington Park and Haworth, the Borough offers a shared transportation van for use by our senior residents. Please keep in mind this is a shared service, not to be confused with an "on demand" service. The service consists of trained and caring individuals who work to meet the needs of the participants. Following an inquiry for this service, residents can be registered. An instruction letter is mailed to the residents. Medical appointments take preference in the schedule. Patience is asked as you may need to arrive early to an appointment or wait for the van to return to pick you up. For residents interested in door to door service, my office can provide information about the Ryde4Life transportation service, which is an ondemand, fee-for-service transportation service.
