Closter's Volunteer Emergency Services

The Borough of Closter has two of the most committed volunteer emergency service organizations in northern Bergen County. Closter's volunteer ambulance corps and fire department were founded on the premise that together volunteers can make a significant difference in the quality of services in the community and, indeed, they have. Since its establishment in 1893 the **Knickerbocker Hook & Ladder Company** is staffed solely by volunteers who donate their time, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, responding to 274 calls last year. Complementing the emergency fire services is the medical emergency response and rescue

operations provided by the men and women of the **Closter Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Corps**. The Closter Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Corps, Inc. is the only department in Bergen County, and one of the few in the state that provides both ambulance service and heavy rescue, inclusive of cliff rescues and rappelling.

A Message from the Closter Tax Collector's Office

Closter's Tax/Finance Office is reminding all property owners February 1st taxes are due. For the convenience of our tax payers, *Property Tax Payments* can be made online. The Tax Office is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 am-4:00pm. A drop box for overnight payments is located in the vestibule of the Lewis St. entrance of Borough Hall. Please do not use this box during normal business hours and, please, do not leave cash in the drop box.

Closter Shade Tree Commission

Shade trees are an essential component of our green infrastructure. Beyond their aesthetic value, shade trees help absorb and clean rainwater, reduce storm water runoff and flooding, improve air quality and, yes, provide shade to pedestrians and and cyclists. What's more, shade trees boost our property values!

Each year, the street trees in one of the Borough's six voting districts benefit from a safety pruning. As a service to or community the STC works to maintain the town's streetscape by trimming and pruning shade trees located along the street. Voting District Five is the geographical area that will be pruned this winter by a certified arbor company. It is anticipated (weather permitting) the work will be completed before mid-February. For purposes of this work, a shade tree is defined as any portion of a street tree within 15' of the curb line. The scope of work will include crown raising, trimming lower branches that block sidewalks or the ability of all vehicles and trucks to approach a curb line, follow Class III Pruning Standards and cut branches that block street lighting or signage.

The proactive work of the Shade Tree Commission has established a beautiful street scape within our community.

Closter Public Library

The Closter Public Library is part of the Bergen County Cooperative Library System (BCCLS). As a member of this system, your Closter library card will be honored in all 76 member libraries of BCCLS. This is a lot of access to books, audiobooks, movies, music, downloadable eBooks, audiobooks, movies and more!

The loan periods for materials will now be the same among all BCCLS libraries. New DVDs -1 week; New books -2 weeks; old DVDs 2 weeks; old books 4 weeks. Items that have no requests will automatically be renewed twice for the full renewal period. This will be done 3 days before the item is due.

The Closter Public Library offers a wide variety of programs and services. *ESL Advanced Conversation* takes place on Mondays, beginning at 10:00 a.m. *Come Knit With Us* and *Mah Jongg* are held on Tuesdays. *Yoga* and *Meditation* are on Wednesdays (please see the schedule). Interested in Real Estate? Join the seminar on Thursday, February 6th at noon. Bring a friend to the 1st and 3rd Friday Flicks! This month the feature films are Judy on Friday, February 7th and Harriet on Friday, February 21st. Movies begin at 1:00 p.m. The Adult Book Club will be discussing *The Nightingale* by Susan Hannah on Wednesday, February 19th at 4:00 p.m. followed by Mom's Night Out Book Club on Monday, February 24th at 7:00 when the club discusses *Olive Again*. Closter Historic Lustron House

Closter's historic Lustron House will be celebrating Valentine's Day at its monthly Open House on Saturday, February 8th from noon to 2:00pm. This 1950 steel house at 420 Durie Avenue (corner of Legion Place) is worth a visit to see what life was like in Closter mid-century.

Just in time for spring and Easter bonnet season, on Saturday, March 14th, the Lustron will have an exhibition of 1950s hats on loan from Nonu Vintage Shop in Dumont and from private collectors. Several of the women's hats were designed by Pauline Reiner, milliner whose shop in Jersey City was very popular in the 1950s and '60s. If you own a special hat or bonnet from this period and are willing to lend it to the Lustron show, please let us know by stopping in at our February Open House.

Closter Police Department

The Closter Police Department is reminding all of us of a couple of "housekeeping" items. All *residential* and commercial building street numbers must be visible from the road and maintained in good repair. This important Borough Ordinance assists our first responders in all types of emergencies, not including medical and fire calls, false alarm calls and general assistance .(B.O. 147-9J).

Overnight parking is prohibited between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Monday through Saturday and between 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Sunday *on any street* in the Borough of Closter (B.0. 183.45B). There is **No Parking on any road which is snow covered** (B.O. 183.45C). **Alarms** ~ all individuals, corporations or businesses operating any **alarm** device must obtain a valid permit on an annual basis. Alarm applications are due by March 1st. Your assistance in complying with the ordinances listed above is appreciated.
