CLOSTER'S HISTORY WITH TOBY & FRIENDS MONDAY, APRIL 5TH

The Borough of Closter is very lucky to have as "Borough Historian" a charming man with a massive memory named Orlando Tobia (fondly nicknamed Toby).

As part of Closter's month-long 30-event celebration of its history, on Monday night, April 5th, at 7 p.m. Mr. Tobia will be joined by six long-time Closter residents at Closter Library, 280 High Street, to reminisce and inform us about Closter's interesting past. Toby's stories about the airfield that was on the Closter/Norwood border in the 1920's and 30's and the escapades of some of his friends and relatives who flew the early planes are better than any play or TV performance one could attend on Monday night.

The program at Closter Library begins at 7 p.m. with a 20-minute film about Closter produced by NJN/ Cablevision in the 1980's and "Talks with Toby & Friends" will follow.

Some of the Closter old-timers who will join Toby to share some memories are June & Alfred Kuhn, Doris Brewster, former Police Chief Bill Brewster, Vilma Potterton and Martha D'Amico.

April 5th is also the opening of the Time Line Exhibit at the Library. The Time Line is a series of photos and artifacts billed as fun facts and surprising truths, amazing photos, and news about Closter through the years. Vintage images of homes, businesses, places of worship and important people from Closter's past cover a 70-foot wall of exhibit space.
